This is a letter regarding Domperidone

29 September 2015

Dear Patient or Prescriber,

Your immediate action may determine the outcome of the availability of domperidone for use in California and/or the U.S.

As you may already know, domperidone is a vital medication for many with either GI paresis or difficulty producing enough breast milk for a newborn child. This medication has been under attack by the FDA and Boards of Pharmacy all over the U.S., including California. Recently two congressmen have petitioned the FDA to hand over copies of all documentation for domperidone and have specifically asked that it be considered for use by being placed on the "positive list" for compounding. A copy of their letter may be found at http://beta.pccarx.com/pdf_files/PA_DomperidoneLetter_FDA_08-25-15.pdf (see attached) The United States Pharmacopeia (USP) is also considering placing a new monograph for domperidone that would then allow the compounding of medications with domperidone.

In addition, the State's Attorney's Office, on behalf of the California State Board of Pharmacy (BP), has filed litigation against Inland Compounding Pharmacy and Pharmacist Raylene Mote. The BP filed the complaint with the State's Attorney's Office pursuant to an anonymous tip. State inspectors came to the pharmacy, isolated and cordoned all supplies of domperidone and completed medications; cutting off 200 + patients from the benefit of domperidone. State inspectors came and reinspected the pharmacy, records, cordoned and sealed domperidone. All were found to be in compliance of previous cease order. The state attorney's office then filed litigation against the pharmacy and Dr. Mote in November of 2014, despite compliance. The complaint alleges that domperidone is unsafe and therefore any use is dangerous. Notice was received in February of 2015. Initial trial date has been set for October 2015. More than 50 prescribers and more than 200 patients found benefit from domperidone. It is the Pharmacy's opinion that the Board of Pharmacy has committed medical maleficence by prohibiting the use of domperidone.

Even if the State court finds no wrong doing, the Board of Pharmacy may still impose disciplinary actions on Inland Compounding Pharmacy and Dr. Mote.

We need your help. Because the FDA and USP are now looking to make available domperidone for human use, your action is needed by writing, telephoning, and/or emailing:
